All the art works will be displayed independently of its form, size, material, technology, if it arrives as a postcard, a letter or a package. Any other type of work delivered in an envelope or in wrapping also will be exhibited if it not only has a link to the topic of R_ECONSTRUCTION but refers to the mail art as well. Number of works is unlimited.

Mail art can be two or three-dimensional works of art posted 'uncovered' and those put into an envelope (or other 'cover') whether they are drawings, graphics, photos, paintings, artists -stamps, stamp carvings, artists books, objects or other works of art connected to the topic stated. Feel free to use the most postal elements or extra services possible (spectacular stamps, registered letter, special delivery) in order to decorate your mail art work.

The exhibition will be presented on the website of the autumn issue of the SpanishFlu NetJournal of Art. Mail art works sent to the exhibition comes to the property of the Marcelland International Art Collection. The organizer institutions establish an International Mail Art Award. Each Award-winners are given a diploma and have the opportunity for an individual web-exhibition of their works in the SpanishFlu WebJournal of Art in 2010.
